We are a 'Reconciling Congregation' where ALL are truly welcome.

Dear Church Family,

We are writing to inform you of an expected upcoming change in our church status. As of this coming July 1, The United Methodist Church at Mount Tabor may be transitioning to a part-time pastor. Our Administrative Council and Staff/Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) have submitted this request to the Bishop and Cabinet and met with our District Superintendent. The request is expected to be honored.

Why is this happening? We simply do not have enough income to offset the cost of expenses as they are. After much discussion, it was decided that reducing to a part-time pastor would be the best option.

What does this mean for our church? Our goal is to continue, and add to, our various ministries, though with less pastoral support. This means more volunteer time will be needed of our members. We are sincerely hoping this is a temporary change only; and that we will be able to return to full-time status once we are financially 'back on our feet.'

What does this mean for Pastor Amanda? There is a possibility Pastor Amanda will remain our pastor, but with another church added under her leadership. There is also the possibility that Pastor Amanda will be moved to a different full-time church. **PLEASE DO NOT DISCUSS THIS WITH OUR YOUNGER CHILDREN, ESPECIALLY GREGORY. Gregory does NOT know about a possible move,** and Pastor Amanda does not want to burden him with that stress until she is informed as to whether she will be staying or moving. This decision comes from the Bishop.

When will we know for sure? Pastor Amanda and our SPRC will be contacted by our District Superintendent. This could happen anytime between now and May.

Please keep our church in prayer. Any questions or comments can be directed to Janet Ryans (SPRC Chairperson), Pastor Amanda, or feel free to attend any Administrative Council Meeting.





News From MO

The Mission Outreach team is alive and kicking in 2020!

Upcoming planned events include:

February: ‘Hugs from the Heart’. Couldn’t we all use just a little bit of kindness to help brighten up our day? Come join us on Sunday February 9th as we decorate and distribute over 100 Valentine’s to our Mount Tabor community for Valentine’s Day. No previous coloring experience required! 9:15am--Making Valentines. Following worship--Valentine distribution.

March: “UMC Rise Against Hunger”. Come lend a hand preparing food to feed the masses! A lofty goal of making thousands of sandwiches is in our hands! Along with hundreds of other volunteers of course! This is a joint venture throughout the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference of The UMC. Our area location for hands-on volunteers: Saturday March 21, 2019 at the UMC in Sparta. Financial donations will also be collected. More info to follow.

April: Interfaith Food Pantry collaborative. We'll be touring the facility and offering some assistance while there. Stay tuned for details!

THANK YOU to those who donated items and/or gave financial gifts for Project Homeless Connect! It was a wonderful success consisting of a great day helping the approximately 120 guests with our vast donations of winter coats, clothing and personal hygiene products from our church community. Here is a short summary of the day: 'Home is a safe haven. Home is where we want to be. But what if it were to disappear? That’s what happened to 388 individuals and 288 households in Morris County, according to a tally last January by area social service organizations. On Thursday January 23, 2020 Project Homeless Connect hoped to make a dent in those numbers by connecting the homeless, and those in danger of becoming homeless, with services that can help. Danielle Pera of the Mental Health Association of Essex and Morris organized the annual event at St. Peter’s Episcopal Church in Morristown. “We have 40 agencies to offer their services to help resolve homelessness here today. We have veterans’ services, housing authorities, food services, medical services, haircuts, food giveaways, and clothes — coats, hats, scarves, gloves — anything that you could possibly need is here. It’s a one-stop shop,” said Pera, who has been in charge for four years. Everything was offered for free.'

Thank you for being a part of this wonderful mission!

We will also be distributing a survey in the near future to ask the congregation what other types of helping in our community you all would like to see for the rest of the year. All we need is a few moments of your time. The MO team is off and running again!



Thank you very much for your 4th quarter 2019 donations totaling 535 pounds of food. Your support makes it possible for us to continue to provide much needed nutrition and resources to the thousands of Morris County residents, who for many different reasons, struggle to put food on the table. Mallory Grossman was a student in Rockaway Township who took her own life at the age of 12 in 2017. ‘Mallory’s Army’ was created to promote both suicide and bullying prevention.

We understand that suicide is a subject very difficult to address with children. Because of this, our Children’s Sunday School class will be focusing on the anti-bullying aspect of Mallory’s Army, along with discussing feelings and mental health, but will NOT be discussing suicide. The topic may be raised in our Youth classes.

Each stone paver can be purchased and engraved in memory of our loved ones for a \$500.00 donation. This will be a great way to support the church and remember those who have passed on. 


