


#### **DEE ERNST**

The next food drive will be Sunday July 30.






A capital fund has been started so if you are able to make a donation, this will help pay for repairs and greatly appreciated.

Covid. Raise your hand if you remember hoarding toilet paper, searching for hand sanitizer, standing 6 feet apart and masking up? We all do right? It was only 3 short years ago. Those were crazy times to put it mildly. Rules, laws and executive orders were changing on what seemed to be an hourly basis. You'd go to bed hearing one thing and wake up being told another. Opinions swarmed like angry wasps from a disturbed nest. And thanks to technology, those opinions were relentless and seemingly unavoidable.

Now, imagine taking on a new job during those times. But not just any job. A leadership role. And you aren't' just reporting corporate sales figures or sharing monthly projections. You're sharing the word of God. Through a mask. Behind Plexiglas. With an accent. Using an antiquated sound system. Outside, competing with trains, planes and automobiles. Talk about feeling set up for failure. Pastor Rosario must have felt ambushed at times. We were all in unchartered waters and it was anything but smooth sailing. The seas were rough to say the least! But God put Pastor Rosario at the helm of our ship not just to steer it, but to defend it, to repair it, and yes to improve it.









Despite the many challenges and obstacles she faced, Pastor Rosario guided our church with perseverance and prayer. Using her legal and finance background, she kept us on course. Thanks to a grant of over \$15,000 that Pastor Rosario applied for and was awarded, we were able to upgrade our sound system and our technology. That upgrade allows us to stream on Facebook and upload to Youtube. She worked with the Trustees and Ned who got us microphones, a camera, and all new behind the scenes electronics to make the magic happen. The grant also pays for our Bell Choir Director, Will and our tech back up, Dylan. I'd say the grant was a godsend but it was really Pastor Rosario who is the godsend. In 3 short years she navigated an uphill battle with grit and grace. And let's not forget that she had the Teabo church to minister to as well.
